A level Geography fieldwork

Fieldwork tailored to each exam board specification: glaciation, place studies, coasts, ecosystems, carbon, and water.

A level Biology fieldwork

Fieldwork tailored to each exam board specification: ecological techniques, woodland ecology, freshwater ecology, and succession.



GCSE Geography fieldwork

Fieldwork tailored to each exam board specification: rivers, flooding, glaciation, rural settlements, coasts, and ecosystems.

All our fieldwork is tailored to meet the requirements of the curriculum or exam board specification. We will work with you to design a programme which suits your requirements.

Health & Safety

The teaching staff running your course are all highly trained and experienced in teaching field studies to a wide range of ages and abilities. Education staff hold first aid qualifications and are trained in H&S and group management, and all sessions and locations are risk-assessed. The Field Studies Council holds the Quality Badge from The Council for Learning Outside the Classroom, awarded to organisations that demonstrate consistently high quality learning experiences and risk management.

A Typical Day

A typical day begins at 10am when one of our field teachers will meet you at Derwentwater Independent Hostel or the chosen fieldwork site. The fieldwork will take place outside for the duration of the day (with a classroom base in the hostel if necessary), returning at around 4pm. Full tuition is provided along with worksheets, equipment and specialist resources. Waterproof clothing, footwear and clipboards can also be provided if requested. FSC minibuss transport is available at extra cost if you want to do studies beyond walking distance of the hostel and do not have your own transport.
